

**Economy improves for third straight month, supported by strong tourism**

~ The consecutive national holidays without pandemic restrictions and inbound consumption were positive factors ~

< Trend in May 2023: Continued improvement >

The economic diffusion index (DI) in May 2023 was 45.4, up 0.8 point from the previous month, for a third straight month of improvement. The domestic economy showed a strong pick-up movement broadly amid further acceleration of a move toward normalization of economic activities and social life.

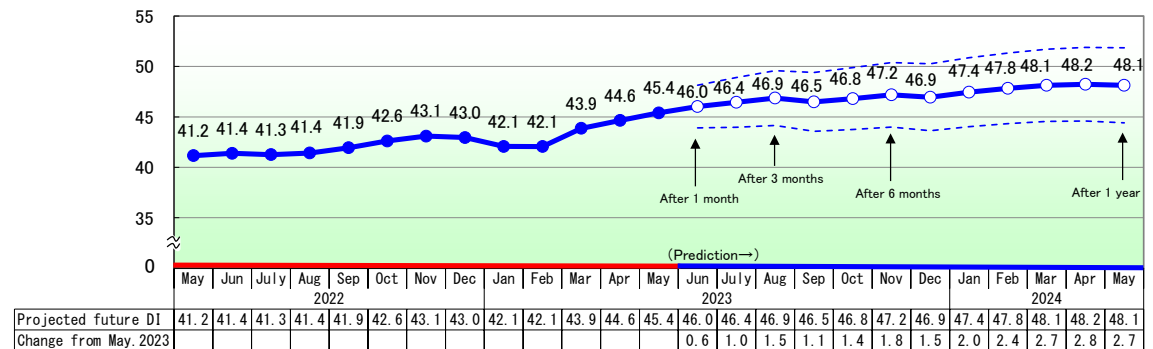
< Future outlook: Continued trend toward gradual recovery >

Although there are concerns about downside factors including rising costs, Japan's economy is expected to show a trend toward a gradual recovery.

By industry: Improved in 9 out of 10 industries, with continued strong demand mainly related to tourism and food and beverage.

By scale: Companies of all sizes showed an improvement for the third straight month as the movement toward leaving COVID behind gained momentum.

By region: All 10 regions reported a third straight month of improvement, driven by travel and tourism in each region.



\*: The economic forecast DI is calculated using the Forecast Combination method of the results of the ARIMA model and the structural equation model.

## 3. Research Period and Methodology

Internet-based survey conducted May 18– 31 2023

### The explanation of the Economic Diffusion Index

#### Research Purpose/Researched Terms

TDB Economic Trend Research (started from May 2002) is a monthly statistical survey conducted for over 27,000 nationwide corporations on their general business activities including the current condition and future outlook of the industry business performance and operating climate. The primary purpose of such a survey is to assess the current state of Japan's economy.

#### Selection of the Subject Corporations

Companies of all sizes in all domestic industries are eligible to participate in the survey.

#### DI Calculation

The DI (Diffusion Index) is calculated by multiplying the number of responses for each assessment category by the number given in parentheses in the table below, to a seven-level assessment rated by companies.

An economic DI of 50 is **the point separating good and bad**, so a DI over 50 means “good,” and below 50 means “bad.” (The numbers are rounded off to one decimal place.) No weight is given according to a company's size, and calculations are made on the basis of “one company, one vote.”
